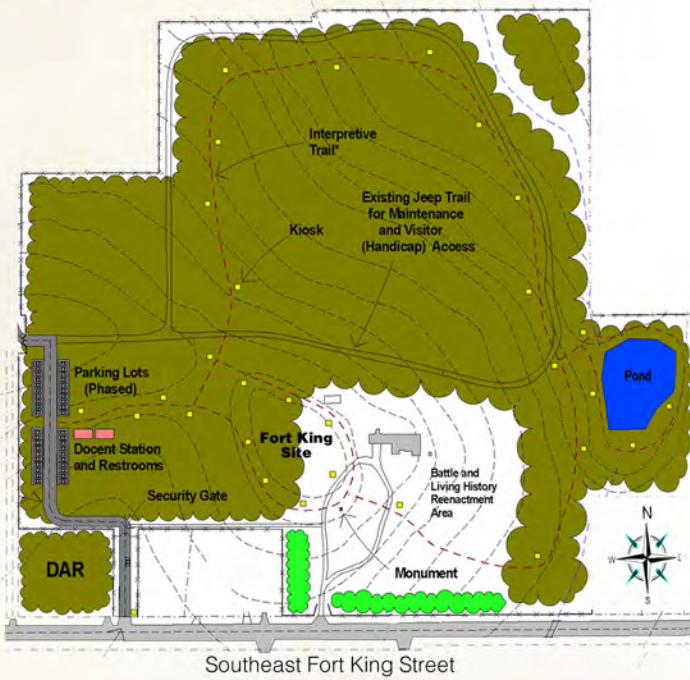


Proposed Historic Park



A view of the 1st Phase of the site. This phase will include an Interpretive Trail, parking area, docent station and restrooms. There are currently 37 acres that make up the historic site. Future plans include reconstruction of the fort.

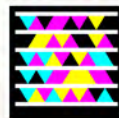
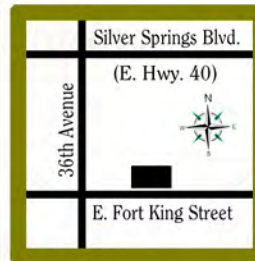
War Chief Osceola, 1804-1838, opposed the removal of the Seminoles from Florida and led them in a war that lasted nearly seven years.
